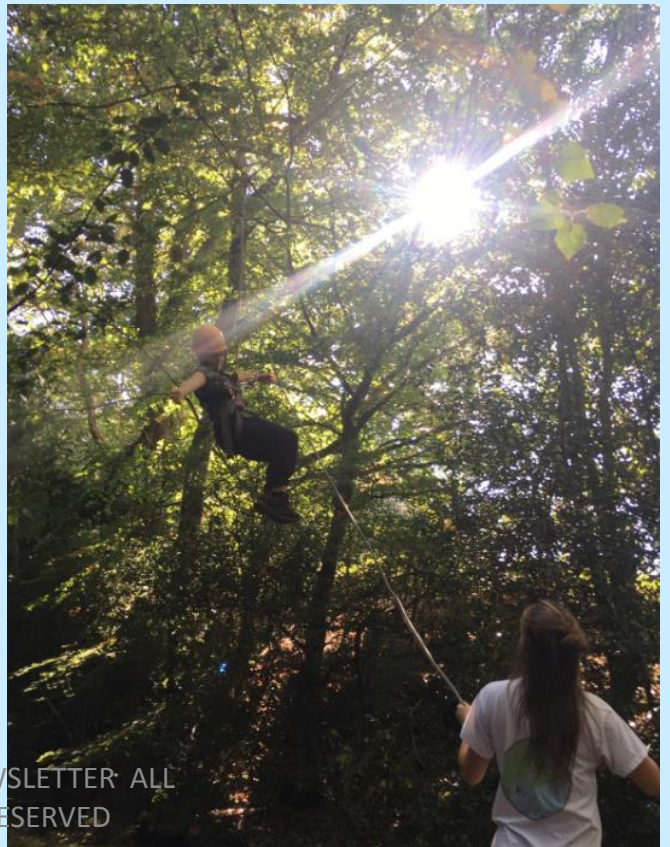
# Year 6 Residential

# Changing for PE

As children progress throughout the school, changing for PE as a class becomes more problematic. I have discussed the various issues with our older children and with the upper KS2 staff. At present, the older children go to the toilets to change into their PE kits but this is fairly impractical and takes up a lot of time.

As a solution, we have agreed that children from Year 4-6 can come in their PE kits when it is their PE day. They will still need plimsolls in school for indoor PE (and a change of top if needed) but can otherwise come in their sports gear ON THEIR PE DAYS.

In the winter, please send your child into school in tracksuit bottoms/leggings, a polo top/t-shirt, warm sweatshirt/hoodie and suitable sports shoes. In the warmer months, please send your child into school in shorts rather than tracksuit bottoms/leggings.

Dear parents/carers,

We have a vacancy for a parent governor and are seeking nominations for an enthusiastic and committed parent or carer to join the governing body. Details of current Governors are on the school website under “About Us”.

The core functions of the governing body are:

- \* Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- \* Holding senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation, its pupils, and the performance management of staff.
- \* Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

The term of office for all governors is four years.

At Coombe Road Primary School we always aim for positive and purposeful partnerships with parents, which undoubtedly bring important benefits to the pupils. One of the most significant ways you can help in promoting this aim is to volunteer to be a parent governor. The governing body’s main tasks are to support the school, ensure that all pupils receive a high quality education and plan for future development and improvement.

Parent governors are welcomed as valued members of the team and play a vital role in ensuring the governing body is aware of the views of parents and the local community.

A copy of the nomination pack is attached. If you are interested in becoming a governor, you may nominate yourself, or ask another parent/carers (not your spouse/partner) of a child at the school to propose your nomination and a different parent to second it – see attached form, which will need to be submitted to the school by 4pm on Monday 19 November 2018.

When nominating yourself or someone else for the role of parent governor, you are nominating the person you believe has the skills and commitment to undertake the role. You are also nominating someone you trust to promote high standards and strategically develop the school. The parent governor’s role is not to represent individual parents’ views or to report back directly to parents.

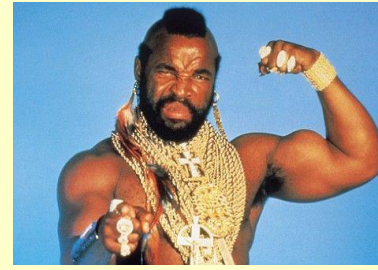

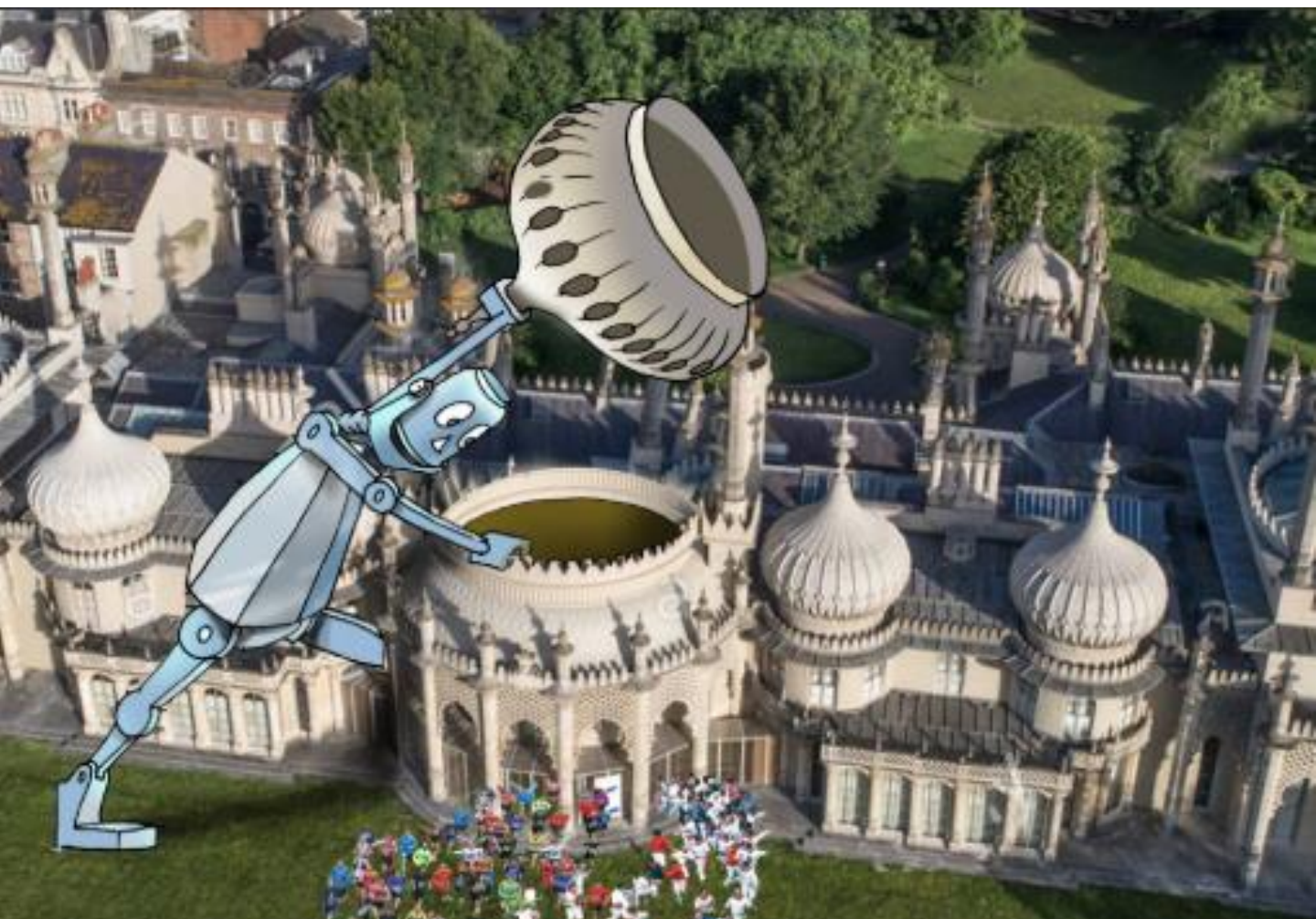
