POSITIVE COVID CASES:

If your child has been in school this week and tests positive for Covid-19 over half term, please alert us by emailing covid@coomberoad.brighton-hove.sch.uk. You will be asked some questions so that we can track others who your child has been in contact with, and help to stop the spread.

Please continue to follow guidance to keep yourself and others safe.

- Wash your hands regularly and for at least 20 seconds.
- Wear a face covering in indoor settings where social distancing may be difficult, and where you will come into contact with people you do not normally meet.





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Stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible, or 1 metre with extra precautions
in place (such as wearing face coverings).
