

Washing Hands

It's REALLY important that you wash your hands when we ask you to. This will help to stop the virus from infecting any of us and spreading through our school.



If you need to sneeze or cough, do it into a tissue – or into your arm (like we have shown you before).



Remember to wash your hands for 20 seconds

What shall I bring to school?

If you want a packed lunch, you can bring this in your lunch bag.

Bring anything you need (not toys) in your book bag as these are really easy to wipe clean (or a suitable bag). You must make sure your adult (or you, if you're older) give any bags/lunch boxes a good wash before bringing them to school – and another good wash when you get home. This will also stop the virus moving from different areas (on surfaces).

Please bring your own water bottle and take it home to be washed as usual. Your water bottle will remain in your class space (as you have done since September).

Can I bring in other things from home?

We can't allow you to bring other things from home. We just can't keep everything as clean as it needs to be and so we will only use the things in school (which we will clean lots).

Reading books will be changed every Friday for now (this is likely to change after Easter) - we'll make sure the books are clean, then we know there's no risk of infection from that pesky Covid!



What shall I wear?

You should wear your uniform as usual, and make sure that you bring a raincoat. This is because we will be outside as much as possible (it is better to be outside in the fresh air). We will have windows and doors open so make sure that you are wearing warm clothes on a cooler day. The weather is changing now we're going into spring – so hopefully we'll start to see more sunshine and get outside as much as possible. All uniform can be ordered online (we know that most shops are still closed) – but we do have some spare uniform if you need it.


Your teacher will let you know about PE kits later. For now, you do not need to bring your PE kit.



Where will I be?

Having smaller groups of children means that we can stop Covid from spreading easily, and make sure we keep a safe distance from each other (it likes people to be close to each other).

You will do most things in school with your class but will be part of a 'bubble'. The 'bubble' will eat lunch together, share toilets and play on the same playground. You should not enter other bubbles and stay in your own.

What will happen at the gate?

You will need to queue at your gate (keeping your distance) if it is not yet open. Try not to arrive too early so that you are not having to wait (and causing crowds).

Your adult should wear a face covering if they are able to.

Once your teacher is there to greet you, you must say goodbye to the adult dropping you off (and there can only be one) at the gate (just like we have been used to).



Do I need a face covering?

You do not need to wear a face covering in school but all adults will be wearing a face covering for most of the time – especially when speaking to other adults and in corridors and the lunch hall. You're very used to this now though, aren't you?

Your adults will also wear a face covering if you hurt yourself – or if you have a toilet accident. This is because we need to get close to you – and we know that Covid likes this (we don't want it to like anything we do). If you need lots of first-aid, we might ask you to also wear a face covering (which we have) for extra protection. We would only do this if you feel comfortable wearing one.

If you travel to school by public transport, you and your adult will need to wear a face covering on the transport.

What will happen at lunch time?

You will still eat your lunch in the main hall as you have been doing. We will need to make sure that bubbles are not mixing, so the times you are used to may change. You'll see Jackie and Angie and they will also be wearing face coverings some of the time.

If you want to bring a packed lunch, just make sure it's in a very clean lunch box or bag – and make sure that only you touch it. Do not share your food with others.






Where will I have playtime?
