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


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If a child develops symptoms of Coivd19, you must seek a <u>PCR test</u> which you can book online https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

BEHAVIOUR REGULATION:

We are currently working on our Behaviour Regulation Policy and hope to get our parents and carers involved with this.

Currently, we use a range of strategies to support our children to regulate their own behaviour. We are a place of education and therefore support our children to learn how to be responsible and appropriate ways to handle conflict or friendship issues. Our policy can be found on our website in the 'Policies' section – https://coomberoad.sites.schooljotter2.com/about-us/statutory-information

The policy explains the language we use, as well as the 'Just Right' approach.

House Points (also known as Dojos) -

There are 4 Houses throughout the school. Relatives are placed in the same House. The House System and awarding HPs (House Points) is consistent throughout the school. 5 or 10 HPs tend to be awarded (20 HPs would be very rare and for an exceptional incident/deed).

HPs are awarded for following the CORE values or for demonstrating kindness etc.



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- When rewarding House Points, the adult verbalises why they are awarding the points e.g., "5HPs for good listening, 5HPs for showing commitment to this activity, 5HPs for trying something new (seeking opportunity), 5HPs for being so polite (showing respect), etc."
- HPs are recorded using 'Class Dojo' or on a class chart and an average score for the
 individual Houses is worked out so that the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th places can be sent to the
 Headteacher at the end of the week to find out the totals for each House. These are
 celebrated in Golden Assembly.
- The children with the most HPs in each House are celebrated as 'Top Scorers' (also celebrated in Golden Assembly).
- The Headteacher/Assistant Headteacher also awards HPs to Houses and individual children (these are recorded in the Golden Book). Children wearing House badges can be 'spotted' easily and tend to receive these HPs, particularly at the moment when we are keeping to 'bubbles' – so please make sure that your child's House Badge is part of their uniform.
- Classes may also have additional 'rewards' related to the House Point system for every child in the class to earn together e.g. marbles in a jar, extra 5 minute play time.

Golden Pupil -

Each week a child is chosen from each class (and some intervention classes) and celebrated in Golden Assembly. They receive a 'golden' sticker and certificate.

Emotional Needs -

Children are at varying emotional stages and will be treated and spoken to according to their individual needs.

Our children are taught to understand difference and that what they need compared to another child may be very different - we will always be fair but this may not always feel equal. Relationships sometimes go wrong and it is normal to have conflicts, particularly in a school environment with a variety of so many children in one place. We will always support the children to repair relationships that go wrong.

PARENT/CARER CONSULTATIONS:

Thanks to all of you who were able to attend these meetings and we hope that you found them informative. There will be no statutory tests this year but we will provide you with an end-of-year written report in July, which will give you information on how much progress your child is making (related to the National Curriculum) as well as their next steps in reading, writing and mathematics - and how you can support. You will have an opportunity to discuss this further with your child's teacher should you wish to do so.
