


Parent conferences

Cricket

We are also very excited to have a cricket specialist from Sussex Cricket in school to improve our KS2 cricket skills during PE lessons and lunchtimes.

He has been teaching the children during the school day but there is a free after school cricket club on Wednesdays if any KS2 children want to join.

Attendance

Attending school is required by law. If a child's attendance falls below 96%, we will make you aware.

If your child's attendance is poor, we will invite you in for an Attendance Support Meeting to discuss it. We will follow the attendance policy and you are at risk of a fixed penalty notice of £60 per parent per child if your child's attendance falls below 90%.

Holidays will not be authorised but you will need to fill in a 'Leave of Absence' form for safeguarding purposes (so that we know you and your family are safe). If we are unable to contact you, we may refer the case to Front Door for Families. There are only very exceptional circumstances when leave of absence can be granted so if you book a trip away during term time, your case will be referred to the local authority.

Please continue to call us each day your child is absent from school on 01273 077130. This is a safeguarding procedure so that we are aware your child and family are safe. We may ask for medical evidence if your child's attendance is poor due to illness. In some cases we may seek support from the school nurse.




Happy Mountain competition

Having studied them carefully and used their observation skills, they drew them in charcoal first before having a go at using and developing their sculpting skills.




The results have been very detailed and impressive. Well done year 4!

Reading at home expectations

As you are aware, we encourage all our children to read regularly at school and at home. This enables them to make more progress in all areas of the curriculum. However, our monitoring of reading diaries suggest that a lot of parents and carers are not reading with their children at home on a regular basis.

Your child has a 'Reading Diary' in which we ask that you record the date they read, the book title, a comment and a signature. If your child reads on their own, they can write in the diary but we need you to sign it too please.

We fully appreciate that finding time to read can be tricky but we suggest that you try to read at least 4 days per week:


Day 1 – Read to your child.

Day 2 – Your child reads his or her book to you.

Day 3 – Read to your child.

Day 4 – Your child reads his or her book to you.

To help you, all of this information can be found on the inside cover of your child's reading diary.



Feedback from our reading workshop was that you loved being able to come into school to read with your children. In response, we will trial an open invitation to parents or carers of children in Poppy, Buttercup or Sunflower Class to come and read with their child on the first Monday of each month.

We will provide more details nearer the time but the first day will be Monday 6th March.
